Mina finds their future together in jeopardy.

Krakow, 1824. This Finlandia-nominated prequel follows the young Professor Wiktor Worowski after an accident leaves him disabled. He apprentices under clocksmith Seweryn Król, who also teaches him magic and illusion. Together, the two repair something mysterious, before meeting Tom whose existence brings danger to their doorstep. The three must protect their secrets while Wiktor must also fight for his lost love.

#3 THE MASTERS OF ILLUSION

Tinasotamiehet, WSOY 2020, 397pp

Meanwhile, Professor Worowski reunites with his old flame Zofia, and Tom uncovers a riddle tied to an Arthurian legend. As their most dangerous enemy reappears, Tom and Mina must face a showdown as epic as Camelot itself that determines the fate of their future together.





Teenager lan lives on his own and passionately composes electronic music. A newcomer Elias has recently inherited his biological father's house on the street and has a dream of developing the perfect role-playing game. When the mysterious K turns up at Turnaround, the fates of the three young people begin to intertwine in an astonishing way.

Marisha Rasi-Koskinen has been described as a literary genius for her magical ability to obscure reality, creating works that reveal an entirely different story upon a second reading. In The Fallen, she dazzles readers once again, posing the question: how do we perceive reality?

Rasi-Koskinen's debut YA novel, The Dark Side of the Sun (Auringon pimeä puoli, WSOY 2019), earned her three literary prizes in Finland, including the prestigious Finlandia C&YA Prize. The Fallen, her second YA title, was also nominated for the Finlandia upon publication.


